In or assembly on Tuesday we launched our fundraising project to help Ukrainian children. We will be holding separate fundraising events on Tuesdays which we will let you know about in this newsletter.

The charity we are supporting is **Save the Children** who are part of the DEC's (Disaster Emergency Committee) Ukraine Humanitarian Appeal.

Our first event will be **next Tuesday (March 22<sup>nd</sup>)** when we have asked the children to come to school in either a yellow or blue top (T-shirt, sweatshirt or jumper) with either their school trousers or skirt. Don't worry if they haven't got either colour as they can wear their P.E. T-shirt.

We will be getting the school together on the field to make a Ukrainian human flag as we remember the Ukrainian Children who are facing very difficult times. We ask that you make a donation for this special event.

We ask that any donations you want to make to the various events are paid via the Schoolgateway if possible. Otherwise cash in a sealed labelled envelope will be gratefully received.

You might be interested to know that a local company who did some work for our school asked us not to pay them but to contribute the £150 to a charity supporting Ukrainian children. A very kind gesture and gets our fundraising off to a good start! We have also adopted a Cafod Prayer as our school prayer for this appeal. We have shared the school prayer on the front of this newsletter in case you want to use it at home.
