Ways to help at home

Mathematics

Our new learning will include:

- -Measuring and estimating volume and capacity
- -Learning or consolidating how to tell the time on an analogue and digital (12/24-hour) clock
- -Identifying, measuring and drawing different angles
- -Exploring the properties of polygons
- -Reflecting and translating shapes
- -Multiplying fractions by a 1-digit number
- -Solving problems relating to money and budgets.

Ways to help at home

- -Encourage children to learn their times tables at speed up to 12 x 12.
- -Prompt your child to tell the time at various points of the day.
- -Involve your child in measuring activities (like baking) and working out money transactions.

Pentecost

We learn the new life of the Easter message is spread through the power of the Holy Spirit. Revisiting the account of the Pentecost, we explore the Spirit's transforming power. By following the story of Saul/Paul, we also discuss how his message about the Spirit applies to Christians' everyday lives today.

Topic

History - Children will be learning about the invasion and settlement of Britain by the Scots and Anglo-Saxons (we will focus on the Vikings next half-term), various aspects of life during this era and their legacy.

Geography - We will use maps to understand where the invaders were from and which parts of Britain they settled in. We will explore their use of land and natural resources.
