<u>Year 3</u> had a busy time in the Nature Area. For Science, they are learning more about their bodies specifically about muscles and bones. They put those to the test! Designing fitness challenges for a Jedi knight, a fitness trail for others to test and practising their powers of observation/hiding and finding. They should sleep well!



The children in <u>2 Seahorses</u> are preparing for Christmas. They were making paper chains using strips of paper.

A group of children joined their paper chains together. We measured the length of their creation in the hall. Twelve children made the longest chain of 12m 30 cm. One child worked conscientiously on his own and created a chain 2m 40cm.

We then discussed which child had created more links in their chain. We worked out that 12 metres divided by 12 children meant that each child had created just over a

metre, whereas one child had made a chain that was double that length.







Yesterday, some of <u>Year 6</u> received a workshop from Now's the Time for Change from Tracy and Kelly, funded by the NHS. The children participated in various activities discussing and improving their resilience. All the children involved said how much they had enjoyed it and were given so many ideas for future challenges that they may face.

The rest of Year 6 participated in a similar workshop in the hall. We discussed a variety of strategies to deal with stress including meditation, praying, exercise, breathing and stretching.

A good afternoon was had by all.
