

## The Great Plague

The children in <u>Year 2</u> learnt all about the Great Plague in 1665. The children collaged rats, and learnt how the rats spread the plague from person to person. We played Ring a Ring o' Roses, learning that the poem was actually created after the plague.

RING A RING OF ROSES- pink spots were a sign that you had caught the plague.

A POCKET FULL OF POSIES – the herbs and spices and flowers people carried to sniff clean air. ATISHOO ATISHOO- related to the sneezing when the disease had been contracted.

WE ALL FALL DOWN- people died from the plague.

The children mixed herbs and spices and ground them to a powder to make sweet smelling cures for the plague. The children loved their learning today!
