Dear parents/carers.

Please see below the poster from the school nursing team which has details of community health clinics being held in Southend for children aged between 5-11.

Parents and carers of children aged 5-19 in Southend can text a school nurse on 07507 331884. When contact is made, a member of the school nursing service can offer advice and support with a variety of health issues including growth and development, emotional wellbeing, growing up, sleep, Immunisations, toileting, and healthy lifestyles. This service is available Monday to Friday (excluding Bank holidays) 09.30-16.30.

Southend School Nursing Referral Criteria

A referral can be made to the School Nursing Team if any concerns are identified as listed below

- Support with managing medical needs in schools.
- Growth and development
- Emotional health and wellbeing
- Vision and Hearing. Dental health.
- Sleep.
- Enuresis (bedwetting), constipation and soiling concerns that are not managed by the continence team and/or GP
- Immunisation advice.
- Common childhood illness
- Growing up, puberty and relationships.
- Any other general health concerns.

The expectation is that if there is an agency supporting the health need of the child/young person that the school will not refer for school nursing support. Schools should liaise directly with the agency supporting the child's health need for advice/guidance. School nursing can be contacted for service details if they are required.

For example, if a CYP is seeking supporting from a school councillor, MHST, SET CAMHS or any other external health agency then the School Nurse Team will not see the child or young person as they will be seeking support from the relevant specialist agency already.
