English:

Reading - Class reader this term will be the Butterfly Lion by Michael Morpurgo. We will be using this book to develop the children's comprehension, reading and vocabulary skills.

Writing - this half term the children will be using 'Talk for Writing' to write a discussion text involving setting both sides of an argument and reaching a conclusion.

Mathematics:

Big Maths – Understanding numbers to 2 decimal points. Adding tenths and halving 2 and 3 digit numbers.

Geography:

<u>History</u>

Children will be learning about the Anglo-Saxons and Scots this half term, investigating the invasions of the Scots and Anglo-Saxons in the 5th century. They will find out where they came from and where in Britain they managed to settle, looking how life in Britain changed as a result. The children will learn how the Anglo-Saxons influenced the English language, examine and analyse and learn what life was like in a typical Anglo-Saxon village. Finally they will investigate how and why the Anglo-Saxons were largely converted to Christianity by the early 7th century.
