Literacy

We will be continuing to develop our handwriting and presentation skills across all subjects.

We will be learning to write a news report. Talk For Writing will be used to encourage children to recognise features of a text with the aim of the children incorporating these features in their writing.

Spelling and grammar: we will continue to learn the spellings of the Common Exception Words for Year 1 and Year 2 and looking at different spelling rules. We shall also look at the tenses past and present as well as the present continuous tense. e.g I swam, I swim, I am swimming.

Ways to help at home

Listen to your child read daily and ask them questions about the text.

Mathematics

We will be learning to use our number fact knowledge to help us in other areas of maths we will be learning how to use what we know to help us learn something new. We will revisit all areas of our learning this year and using our number skills to help us to solve problems.

Ways to help at home: Reinforce child's learning by using mathematical vocabulary at home. Practise the time at home. Help them to understand the fifteen-minute intervals quarter past and quarter to and then 5-minute intervals. Remember to practise the 2-, 5-, and 10-times tables for bronze award and the 3- and 4-times table for silver

RE

Our topics this term is Dialogue and Encounter. The children will use role play and writing to show feelings and demonstrate understanding. We will also be learning about God's Love in the community. Ways to help at home

Talk to your child about their religious education studies.

PSHE

The children will learn about living in community. They will look at the story of The Good Samaritan and learn that God made us to be in loving relationships with one another.
