In Maths, **2 Oysters** have used chocolate to demonstrate their halving skills.



Both **year 3** classes `exploded' their volcanos using a mix of bicarb soda, fairy liquid and vinegar. If parents would like to do the experiment at home, they can look up the British Science Museum, exploding volcano YouTube video.



Year 6 visited Westcliff beach to investigate habitats. They were comparing the various beach habitats to the information Farmer Carl had given them regarding habitats round the farm. Not only did they find habitats, they discovered many exciting artefacts including a clay pipe! Later in the morning, Year 6 designed beach art, their designs were amazing.



Year **1 starfish** had great fun creating firework pictures. We thought about words to describe their noise (and heard the term Onomatopoeia) and even had a firework rocket race into the Parle- Pavillion !



Year 6 are also studying Evolution and specifically looking at the work of Charles Darwin. They are comparing this to their RE learning from last term regarding Creation and analysing both points of view. Today, they discussed similarities and differences between each other, their parents and siblings. They thought about genes and DNA. They were given

playdough and using the same colours for the face and features, look how differently they all turned out!



Year 6 had a practical morning of Maths activities. They were using their measuring skills for Capacity, Length and Weight, also trying to convert measures where appropriate.

**1Jellyfish** had a very busy morning in the Nature Area. Their Science topic this half term is Materials. Firstly, we blindfolded a partner, we gave the partner a material from the nature area and asked them to describe it. We shared good vocabulary for describing all the different materials we found. We also made a habitat for a teddy, making sure our teddy was safe, warm and dry. The last activity was a having a fire. We learnt

about our fire triangle, keeping safe around the fire and also cooked marshmallows which we enjoyed in between two biscuits.
