How many people live there?(Population)

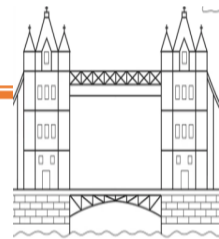
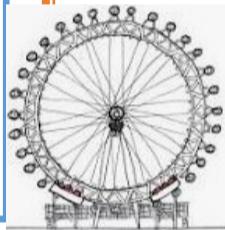
What is the climate like? (Hours of sunshine and rainfall)
