### **Education, Health and Care** Needs Assessment (EHCNA)

An Event for ParentCarers

Southend SEND Independent Forum (SSIF) continues its series of valuable informative events for ParentCarers of children with SEND with the fourth seminar of the year: "Education, Health and Care Needs Assessment (EHCNA)".

#### About the event

This seminar is aimed at ParentCarers who have applied for or are thinking about applying for an Education. Health and Care Plan (EHCP), but would like to find out if it is necessary or right for their Child or Young Person.

We will aim to answer questions such as:

- What does an EHCNA entail?
- Which services are involved?What happens after the assessment?
- · What is my role and responsibility as a ParentCarer?

We have a panel of professionals from the Special Educational Needs and/or Disabilities (SEND) Team, Health and Education who will talk about the assessment process. They will also bust some common myths

We are inviting ParentCarers to submit any questions they have for the panel by email, by Monday 10th March 2025, via email, to jody@southendsendindependentforum.org.uk. This is to save time in the room on the day as our speakers will build their presentations around the answers to these questions

There will also be an opportunity for people to participate in a coproduction session to develop a useful route map/flow chart of the EHCNA process.

### \*\*\*AFTERNOON TEA – ARRANGEMENTS FOR MOTHERS' DAY EVENT 2025\*\*\* WEDNESDAY 26 MARCH

Dear Families,

Mothers' Day is fast approaching and we are planning a slightly different "event" this year, in partnership with FOSH.

On Tuesday 25 March, the whole school will bake cupcakes, supported by Mrs Butcher, our catering manager, who has very kindly agreed to operate the ovens after service on that day. The children will then decorate those cupcakes on the morning of Wednesday 26 March.

We are inviting "mums," or any significant adult to come along for "afternoon tea" on Wednesday 26 March. Year 1, Year 2 and Year 3 classrooms will be set up as "tea rooms," and families will collect their cupcakes and drinks from the hall, then sit together in one of the "tea room" classrooms.

We are planning to do this in houses so that "significant adults" can be with all the children in the same family. We are asking adults to arrive at school as follows:

- 1.30pm St Andrew's (Gates open 1.20 and close 1.30)
- 1.50pm St David's (Gates open 1.40 and close 1.50)
- 2.10pm St George's (Gates open 2pm and close 2.10)
- 2.30pm St Patrick's (Gates open 2.20 and close 2.30)

Adults should come to the playground **VIA THE CAR PARK** at the appointed time – gates will open 10 minutes beforehand and close promptly to ensure the smooth running of the event.

Teachers will take the children from that house onto the playground to meet their adult and families will enter the hall from the Year 1 outdoor entrance to the hall. There will be a one way system in the hall where families will collect their tea and cakes and then have a sit down in one of the tea room classrooms.

Children who do not have a significant adult who is able to attend will have tea and cakes with staff in different areas in the school and they will box up a cake or two to take home.

#### There is no charge for this event.

However, to ensure that we cater adequately, we are asking adults to book in advance for the afternoon tea event via the Schoolgateway so that we can gauge numbers. Please note this event is for **one guest only per family**.

#### \*\*\*The last day for booking on will be MONDAY 17 MARCH.\*\*\*

There will be strictly no admittance on the day without a booking so please spread the word as we don't want anyone to miss out!!

We are planning to organise a similar event for Father's Day - a treat will be decided!
