# **Educational Transitions**

An Event for ParentCarers



SSIF invite ParentCarers of Children or Young Person with SEND to their final Seminar this year. 'Transitions' is the last in a series of valuable and informative events for ParentCarers that have run throughout the year.

## About the event

This seminar is aimed at ParentCarers who have a Child or Young Person with SEND, who is approaching a Transition year at school.

In this case when we say 'transition', we mean things like:

- · starting nursery or pre-school,
- starting primary school,
- · starting secondary school,
- leaving Secondary school.

We also mean any 'Key Stage' transitions - for example - the move from Early Years to Key Stage 1, or from Key Stage 1 to Key Stage 2 and so on.

We will also be discussing your role and responsibility as a ParentCarer.

A panel of professionals from the Special Educational Needs and/or Disabilities (SEND) Team and Education will talk about the transition process. They will also bust some common myths.

We are inviting ParentCarers to submit any questions they have for the panel by email, by Monday 16<sup>th</sup> June 2025, via email, to jody@southendsendindependentforum.org.uk. This is to save time in the room on the day as our speakers will build their presentations around the answers to these questions.

There will also be an opportunity for people to review a useful visual guide about the Transition process.
