

Phonics

The children will continue to work through our phonics programme and begin to recognise and apply sounds, including digraphs and blending. We will be revisiting phase 3 and 4 and teaching phase 5. Tricky words will be taught in groups fortnightly.

Literacy

The children will continue to learn the alphabet and alphabetical order. They will also rewrite a part of a traditional tale with a focus on their letter formation in addition to securing the use of finger spaces and constructing basic sentences using correct punctuation e.g capital letter and a full stops. The children will listen to and engage with arrange of traditional tales through their topic work.

Ways to help at home

Read with your child, note any difficulties or successes in our yellow reading record book.

Mathematics

Revise common 2D and 3D shapes.
Measurement – Investigating weight
To read, write and understand number sentences using =, + and -.
To know the number bonds to 10.
Recognising 2d numbers and counting backwards from 20.

For example

1+9, 2+8, 3+7, 4+6

To be able to count in 5s to 100.

Ways to help at home; Look at shapes when you are at home or out. Count objects and try some simple sums. Practice writing numbers too.

Music

Linking sounds with, and naming certain instruments, and playing them.

Class and Christmas songs.
Music making, using beats, rhythms and clapping.

Ways to help at home

Listen to, and sing along to music.

Topic help at home:

The children will be listening to and discussing a wide variety of Fairy tales. Talk about your own favourite and why. There are lots of fairy tales with recurring language and slightly different story lines, discuss differences and language with your Child after reading with them.

ICT

The children will use the Paint programme on the laptop – to draw, select shapes, fill in colour. This will link with their history work.
ICT work related to current topic.

Ways to help at home

Talk to your child about the safe use of the internet.

Discussing how simple diseases spread and simple hygiene rules.

Ways to help at home

Children practising changing independently at home – particularly working on shirt and blouse buttons.

Branch 2-Prophecy and promise.
