Research the betrayal of Jesus by Judas Iscariot. Then, either:

- (a) Draw a cartoon strip of what happened.
- (b) Or write a diary entry for Judas. Explain how he struggled to remain loyal, the details of his betrayal and how he regretted his actions.

Design a religious Easter card depicting the Good News of the Risen Christ and giving reasons for your choice of words and symbols.

Inside the card, include a suitable quote from Scripture and a greeting to share with others.

NATURE CHALLENGE: If you are allowed, walk around your garden or local park and take photos of or make notes of/sketch the different plants or flowers you see. Can you sort them into categories based on how you think they reproduce? Do some research to find more information!

Read about the arrest of Jesus. Using the account in Luke 22: 39-40, write an explanation of what you think it tells us about God's love and care; and what it tells us about what kind of person Jesus was.



EASTER MATHS CHALLENGE: Create some Easter-themed worded problems! When completed, why not ask your parent/carer if they could make a phone/video call to a friend to test them out! Or you may be allowed to send an email or message.

You wake up one morning and your favourite pet is missing! Write an adventure narrative about your exciting quest to save him or her! List success criteria to ensure you use plenty of wonderful features.

Think about the Stations of the Cross. Focus on one of the following: Jesus is nailed to the cross or Jesus dies on the cross. Then describe what is happening and why Jesus sacrificed his life, making links to any of the Scripture you can find.

Using any materials you wish, create a series of puppets and put on a play to tell the story of Easter.

Draw or paint a picture OR create a collage of a scene in springtime, including plants and animals associated with this joyful season. You can also make a pencil sketch using perspective and include a vanishing point!

Use Scratch to create an educational Maths game. Your questions could be based on the four operations or any areas of Maths we've covered!
