<u>Judaism</u> - Watch this BBC clip about the story of Passover and how Jewish people celebrate today with Pesach festivities - <u>https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/</u> <u>clips/zmq6sbk</u> Draw and decorate a Seder plate; draw and label the special food which goes on it. Challenge: Explain what each item symbolises.

Explain what you saw and how you felt during this experience and afterwards.

Revise what you know about cyber safety by checking this link out: <u>https://www.bbc.co.uk/cbbc/findoutmore/help-</u> <u>me-out-staying-safe-online</u> Then, using your choice of computer software, create an exciting presentation about what you read and watched. For example, you might want to use PowerPoint (make your transitions interesting) or even Word (use bold, italics, underlining and colours to make important information stand out). Look up the Genesis story online and read from the Bible (Genesis 1:1-25). Use this to write a prayer giving thanks to God for his creations in nature. You could start each line with 'We praise you Lord for...'. Decorate the borders of your prayer with nature-inspired artwork. You could draw, paint or even use collage!

Continue reading from Genesis (1:26 -31). Do some research about how God gave humankind the responsibility to care for this Earth. Think about how we can do this. Present your findings any way you like. For example, an information text, mind map, PowerPoint or a poster. Challenge: include references to the Bible.

Can you devise a song, rap, dance, poem or play about your experiences during this Lockdown period? Your creation should express how you feel (remember you can include positive and negative emotions) and your hopes for the future. Make sure you ask someone to record you (and anyone else) performing it!
