1. You have been invited to speak on Sharing Faith with others to be broadcast on BBC Newsround. You are to speak on the programme for about 2 minutes and the title you have been given is – 'A whole new way of living'. Write your script showing how belief in the Good News and the power of the Holy Spirit shapes the lives of Christians today.
2. Paul was a Jew and became one of the friends of Jesus. He travelled many thousands of miles on foot, on horseback and by boat to give the message to the Gentiles, the people who were not Jews. Paul wanted as many people as possible to hear about the Good News of the new life which Jesus brought. So, he travelled around to the towns surrounding the eastern Mediterranean Sea. The Acts of the Apostles tells about those journeys and what happened. He had many adventures during his journeys - Can you find out more about Paul's Journeys? Where did he go? Who did he meet? - Write a short report about Pauls Journey or make a PowerPoint.
4. As Paul, write in character a letter to the Gentiles to explain the Good News about Jesus and the power of the Holy Spirit had brought that God loves everyone.
5. Think of ways in which you could help to spread the Good News at school or at home. Design a colourful picture in celebration of the good news showing the different ways you have thought of.

DT — using recyclable items and anything you have to hand can you design and make something that has moveable parts? Maybe a toy car or bike with moving wheels, a plane or helicopter with moving blades? A boat with sails that move? Be imaginative and sends in your pictures :-)

ICT- Coding and instructions - Do you really know how to make a sandwich? Or a cup of tea? Write detailed instructions and see if you can get someone in your family to follow the instructions and successfully make what you have decided.
