Reading

The Whole class novel will

The children will be
using PowerPoint in

Topic:

Science

Year 3 children will research sources of light and define
darkness.

They will find out about light being reflected from surfaces.

The children will learn about the dangers of direct sunlight
and how to protect themselves.

We will explore shadows and find patterns in the way the size
of shadows change.

Geography-
