English:

Reading - Class reader this term will be the Butterfly Lion by Michael Morpurgo. We will using this book to develop the children's comprehension, reading and vocabulary skills.

<u>Spelling</u> – Children will have weekly spellings to learn and complete spelling activities in class.

Writing - this half term the children will be using 'Talk for Writing' to write a non chronological report on 1 of the big 5 animals as well as working on instructions for keeping exotic pets.

Mathematics:

<u>Big Maths</u> – halving, doubling and partitioning numbers and coin card calculations.

Measurement – time – telling the time and reading and converting between digital and analogue clocks, understanding measurements and converting between different scales, e.g. metres and centimetres.

Times Tables - all times tables up- to 12.

Operations - addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. – to include 5d numbers, decimals to 2 decimal points and fractions

Ways to help at home

Practice times tables and complete any my maths homework set on line.

Geography:

Children will be studying the water cycle, understanding how this relates to weather conditions and considering the effects of pollution and the need for clean water.

Music:

Children engage in an on-line African drumming using our Charanga music programme.

We are hoping to arrange a visit from some African drummers too!

ICT: Using the internet for research activities, designing ppt presentations and supporting learning.
